New bins are now in place for household waste.

Please place all household waste in the green bear-proof bins placed behind the Shareshed to prevent bears and other wildlife from getting into the garbage.

Furniture and large bulky items that are not recyclable should be placed in the large bin alongside the raised ramp. The containers are shipped out in an effort to extend the life of the landfill and save it from filling up.

PLEASE USE THE LANDFILL STICKERS PROVIDED BY YOUR TOWNSHIP when entering the site. These stickers indicate that you have landfill privileges. If you have not received a sticker, please call your local township office.



Our Landfill is nearing capacity and reaching the end of its useful life. As a result, measures have been taken which will reduce the fill rate and extend its lifespan, including shipping the waste out.

But WE NEED YOUR HELP!

By recycling more, reducing what we use and following the new guidelines, you can make a difference. Please do all you can to help keep the landfill open.

Please secure your load before taking it to the landfill. Unsecured loads cause garbage, litter and waste to blow and land on the road and on private property, creating hazards and trash for others.

Voters' Qualifications

A person is entitled to vote at a municipal election if, on voting day, he or she,

- Resides in the local municipality or is the owner or tenant of land there, or the spouse of such owner or tenant;
- Is a Canadian citizen;
- Is at least 18 years old; and
- Is not prohibited from voting

TRAILER PERMITS ARE REQUIRED IN TARBUTT



Tarbutt Council wishes to remind all property owners that Trailer Permits are required each year for trailers or recreational vehicles on all properties for summer or occasional use. Applications can be found on the website at www.tarbutt.ca or by calling 705-782-6776.

Dogs Lost or Found Call the Animal Control Officer: 705-971-6135



Please be a responsible dog owner by purchasing your annual dog tag. Proof of vaccination is required.

Dog Tag Fees:

Microchip, Spayed/Neutered - \$3
Neutered/Spayed - \$5
Not Neutered/Spayed - \$25
Kennel License - \$30
Replacement License - \$5

Leashing and Dog Tags are required for every dog any time they are off their own property



Tags ensure that your dog can be returned to you safely, rather than being seized and treated as a stray.

The cost to release a dog from impound is far greater than the price of a tag.

Dogs wearing tags are a sign that they are cared for and vaccinated and therefore a stranger may more likely take protective action rather than having them impounded.

NOISE AND NUISANCE

All property owners are asked to be respectful of those around them by not creating loud, nuisance noise wherever possible, especially at night.

Residents experiencing excessive noise or nuisance are encouraged to contact the OPP.

Boaters are reminded that watercraft are not to be operated in areas where people are launching boats or swimming. Thank you for being courteous to those around you.

BBQ Tips:

- All barbeque grills must be used outdoors
- Always position the grill well away from combustible objects
- Get your grill cleaned and serviced
- Never leave a lit grill unattended
- Use long handled grilling utensils and heat resistant oven mitts
- Remove grease build-up in catch ways
- Keep a garden hose nearby, connected and ready for use in case of a fire

Tarbutt Council passed the 2022 budget with a zero percent increase in taxes. The figure below shows the allocation of tax money for 2022.

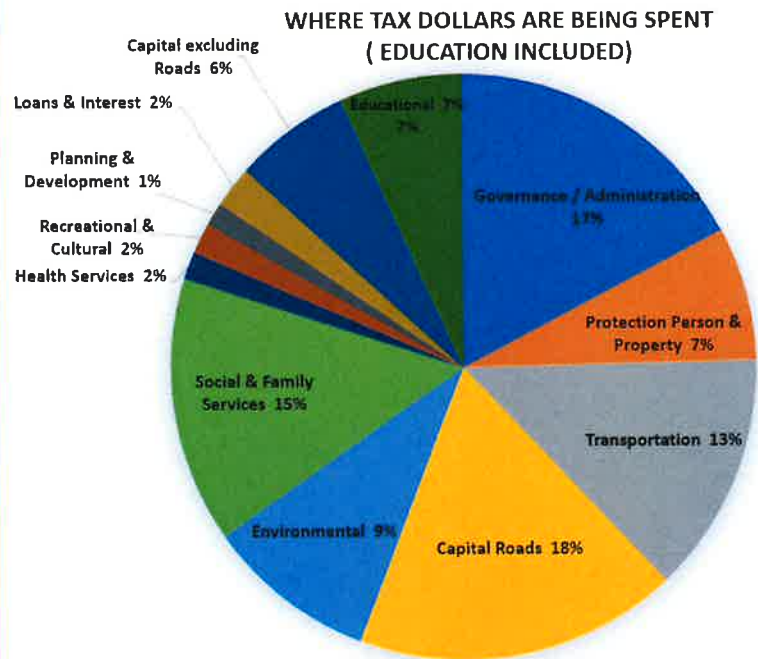


Figure 1: Pie graph showing allocation of taxes for 2022.

Parking Restrictions

Parking is not permitted on Pine Island Road. The Tarbutt Volunteer Fire Department and all emergency services use the Pine Island Road turnaround and the Port Findlay dock area to fill the firetrucks. These areas **shall be clear of vehicles at all times**. In the event of an emergency, all roads must be free of obstructions, please park well off the travelled road

Sea Containers are prohibited on any Shoreline property. Please call the Township for more information.

Look for the mark!

When purchasing and installing smoke and carbon monoxide alarms **look for one of these marks** on your alarms, to ensure it meets the **appropriate Canadian standard**.





Check the bottom of the container. If you see the recycling symbol with a #1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, or 7 in the centre, it is acceptable.

Plastic and Metal recycling for the New Recycling Container:

PLEASE BAG RECYCLING

- All plastic bottles and jars #1 to #7:
- soft drink bottles,
- milk jugs,
- detergent bottles,
- **FLATTENED** cartons,
- aluminum cans,
- pie and baking pans,
- tin cans,
- steel food containers,
- **EMPTY** aerosol cans,
- metal beverage cans,
- baking tins, foil, and food containers are also included in this material category.



All items must be CLEAN OF FOOD

CARDBOARD AND PAPER TOGETHER IN ONE BIN



Please FLATTEN ALL CARDBOARD and BIND it with string.

Cardboard Includes: Corrugated cardboard, shipping boxes, cereal and dry food boxes, shoe boxes, tissue boxes, moving boxes, detergent boxes, soda/beer cartons, and paper towel/toilet tissue rolls.

Paper Includes: newspapers, inserts, labels, magazines, catalogs, paperback books, manila folders, letterhead, notebook paper (no backings), computer paper, envelopes (with windows), coupon books, index cards, calendars, and brown paper bags.

What can't I recycle in the new recycling containers?

- Styrofoam
- Window glass and mirrors
- Electronic waste - TVs and computers (these go in the electronic sea can)



- Motor oil containers
- Yard waste
- Chemical containers
- Shredded paper
- Plastic bags
- Ceramics or dishes
- Food waste
