Leashing and Dog Tags are required every year for every dog any time they are off their own property. Dogs wearing tags are a sign that they are cared for and vaccinated.

Vaccination Requirement: A certificate signed by a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine is required, and indicates that each dog has been inoculated against rabies within the last 24 months.

Pocket guide to emergencies



Three Steps to Emergency Preparedness

Know the Risks
Make a Plan
Get an Emergency Kit



ARE YOU PREPARED?

If an emergency happens in our community, it may take emergency workers some time to get to you. You should be prepared to take care of yourself and your family for a minimum of 72 hours. By taking a few simple steps today, you can become better prepared to face a range of emergencies – anytime, anywhere.

Know the Risk

During an emergency:



1. Make sure you are safe before assisting others.
2. Follow your emergency plan.
3. Get your emergency kit.
4. Monitor radio, television and online for information from authorities. Follow their instructions.
5. Stay put until it is safe or you are ordered to evacuate.
6. Limit phone calls to urgent messages only. Keep the lines free for emergency responders.

Make a Plan



Every household needs an emergency plan. It will help you and your family know what to do in an emergency – and it only takes 20 minutes. Make the plan part of your emergency kit.

Visit GetPrepared.ca to complete an emergency plan online. Then, fill in key information in this booklet for quick access.

Get a Kit

In an emergency you will need some basic supplies. You may need to get by without power or tap water. Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours. Make sure your kit is easy to carry and everyone in the household knows where it is.



Emergency Kit List

- ☐ Water – at least 2 litres per person per day
- ☐ Food that won't spoil, such as canned food, energy bars and dried foods
- ☐ Manual can opener
- ☐ Crank or battery-powered flashlight (and extra batteries)
- ☐ Crank or battery-powered radio (and extra batteries)
- ☒ First aid kit
- ☐ Extra keys (vehicle and home)
- ☐ Cash in smaller bills, and change for payphones
- ☐ A copy of your emergency plan and contact information
- ☐ Special items such as prescription medication, infant formula, and equipment for people with disabilities
