### ARE YOU PREPARED?

If an emergency happens in our community, it may take emergency workers some time to get to you. You should be prepared to take care of yourself and your family for a minimum of 72 hours. By taking a few simple steps today, you can become better prepared to face a range of emergencies - anytime, anywhere.

## Know the Risk

- 1. Make sure you are safe before assisting others. 2. Follow your emergency plan
- 3. Get your emergency kit 4. Monitor radio, television and online for information
  - from authorities. Follow their instructions

# Get a Kit

In an emergency you will need some basic supplies. You may need to get by without power or tap water. Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours. Make sure your kit is easy to carry and everyone in the household knows where it is.
